

**PULASKI TOWNSHIP
REGULAR MEETING
November 14, 2016**

The Pulaski Township Supervisors meeting was called to order at 6:30 P. M. in the Township Building, 3401 Sunflower Road, New Brighton, PA by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. George Hage. Mr. Hage led the Pledge to the Flag.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

William Thomas stated that a meeting will be held on November 22, 2016 at 6:30 P. M. in reference to George Doyle requesting a variance. Mr. Thomas informed the Supervisors that the Planning Commission is responsible for making decisions about variances, consolidating lots, etc. The Zoning Hearing Board has to do with any appeals on zoning issues.

He questioned the situation with the front hill going down to New Brighton. He wanted to know when it is supposed to finished, if the Supervisors have heard anything from Penn-Dot, and suggested that the supervisors contact Penn-Dot. Everyone agrees that something needs to be done now.

Ed Stang was present to ask about an Ordinance in reference to parking on the road. He has a problem with people parking on the road on 39th Avenue and our ordinance does not specify that there has been any designated parking. We do not have off street parking in the township. He also wants the township to have a "No Solicitations" ordinance in the township. He, as well as some other people, has been ripped off and he has been burglarized twice this year. Mr. Stang also questioned about unlicensed, uninspected vehicles in the township. Mr. Albanese stated that the people have been cited for that.
