

**PULASKI TOWNSHIP
REGULAR MEETING
June 13, 2011**

The Pulaski Township Supervisors meeting was called to order at 6:30 P. M. in the Township Building, 3401 Sunflower Road, New Brighton, PA by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. Doug Margetic. Mr. Margetic led the Pledge to the Flag.

In attendance were the following people: Jim Barr, George Doyle, Debbie Hickman, Linda and Tim Breen, Bonnie Hutchison, Norman and Carolyn Bible, Paula Sheets, Joe Kaluza, Frank Chufe, Mark Kehoe, Scott Roeder, Betty Margetic, John Clay, Rich Morrell, and Attorney Budicak.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Byron Mooney to accept the minutes of the May 9, 2011 Work Session, May 9, 2011 Meeting and May 23, 2011. Vote on the motion was: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

A motion was made by Byron Mooney and seconded by George Hage to accept the Treasurer's Report and to pay the bills. Vote on the motion was: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Police: Officer Walton was present. A report for May with a total of 67 calls was turned in to the supervisors. He had nothing to report.

Fire Department: Scott Roeder, Fire Chief was present. He reported there were four fire calls in Pulaski and five in Daugherty. There was nothing to report.

Code Enforcement/Zoning Officer: Mr. John Clay, Code Enforcement Officer, was present. He reported he had twelve calls in May. Four building permits were issued in May. He reported that he had a call from the architect for Pulaski Homes and they will be contacting the township in reference to building permits. Mr. Clay also was able to contact the mortgage company that has the property on 40th Street and informed that the grass needs taken care of or they will be cited. The legal department for the company said that it will be taken care of this week.

Recreation: Mr. Barr was in attendance. He had nothing new to report on the Recreation Commission.

Roads: Mike has been busy cutting grass, patching potholes, spreading millings and picking up branches. Mr. Mooney said Mike has been doing a great job. He needs to cut grass on the west side of the garage, but there is a lot of poison ivy there. He has been spraying it.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Bryon Mooney to accept the Committee Reports. Vote on the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Hage presented some information to the Supervisors in reference to having help for short term work to be done in the township. One was from Labor Ready and the other company was Gregg Staffing Solutions in Cranberry Township. He preferred the Gregg Staffing program. They will supply people, pay their insurance, do their payroll, workmen's compensation, etc. The township needs to have a specific project in place. We tell them what we want to pay per hour and they will add their fee and that is all we have to do. Mr. Mooney still wants Penn Pavilion. Mr. Margetic and Mr. Hage both stated that the public has objections to Penn Pavilion inmates working in the township.

NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Doug Margetic to give a contribution of \$100.00 per month to the Pulaski Township Volunteer Fire Department to help with the utility bills. Vote on the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

Quotes were received from Gable Tree Service and Tom Sipes to trim trees on 30th Street, 33rd Avenue, 34th Avenue, 36th Street, 41st Street, upper part of 43rd Street and. Tom Sipes spelled out his quote in detail. The Gable Company was a lump sum. The secretary was told to have the Gable Company spell out their quote in detail. The matter was tabled and may be decided at the meeting on Wednesday, June 15, 2011.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Rhonda West of 43rd Street had called to see about wires being moved on the light pole. She was instructed to call Duquesne Light and have them call Mr. Clay so the matter can be taken care of.

Mr. & Mrs. Breen were present to object to vacating 40th Lane. They will not be able to attend the meeting on Wednesday and asked to be heard tonight. After some discussion and explanation of the situation with her driveway, Attorney Budicak recommended that the supervisors cross it off the list.

The meeting for closing streets was advertised in the paper for June 13, 2011 and was postponed until Wednesday, June 15, 2011. A typographical was in the letter that was mailed to all the residents involved stated that it was for June 15, 2011. An ad was put in the paper about the Special Meeting for June 15, 2011.

Mr. George Doyle complained about the minutes from the last meeting not containing the fact that Steve Procovich handed Mr. Mooney papers about criminal charges against Mr. Doyle. He plans to bring a civil suit for malice. After some discussion, he asked Mr. Margetic to resign because he is doing a terrible job.

Mrs. Hickman asked Officer Walton about a white motorcycle seen in the township. She wanted to know if it was the Police Departments. Officer Walton said it belongs to the Sheriff's Department.

Joe Kaluza inquired about the junk cars at the Beaver Property on 31st and 46th Street. He said he going to go to KDKA about it if something isn't done. Mr. Beaver made the comment that he would cover them with a tarp so the township couldn't do anything. Mr. Clay spoke to Mr. Beaver and his father about the vehicles and equipment. Mr. Beaver was sold out from under at his place of business and is in the process of looking for a building to move everything to. Mr. Clay informed that he can't keep them at his property. The supervisors agreed that they should help him until he can relocate. Mr. Clay would like to have everything out of there in two weeks.

Mrs. Hickman asked about the trailers parked at Mr. Beaver's. Mr. Clay said that the trailers are registered.

Mr. Chufe asked how Mr. Clay is paid. He was told his salary and hours. Mr. Chufe doesn't think he is doing anything. He also complained about Mrs. Teapole's property on 38th Street. Mrs. Teapole is in a nursing home and is now aware of the situation and is trying to find someone to get the grass cut. He is also complaining about more than one car that is not licensed and current registration plates on someone's property. Mr. Clay explained that he can tow tag them, but the owner then moves it somewhere else before the hearing and the magistrate drops the charges and the township is wasting money for nothing. Then the process starts all over again.

Mr. Morrell complained about the chevron signs on Blockhouse Run Road at the bend past the Willow Tree Estates Park. Signs are 12 feet high. The secretary said she contacted Penn-Dot and they said they would take care of the matter. She will contact them again.

Mr. Kehoe asked Attorney Budicak about the 49th Street problem. Attorney Budicak said he will have something in place by the next regular meeting.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Margetic reminded everyone to fly their flag on Flag Day.

He announced that a special meeting for the consideration of adopting an ordinance closing paper streets, alley, etc. will be held on Wednesday, June 15, 2011 at 6:30 P. M.

Also, a work session is scheduled for June 27, 2011 at 6:00 P. M. in reference to our grant with our engineer, Tom Zeglin from Daniel C. Baker Associates.

The next regular meeting will be held on Monday, July 11, 2011 at 6:30 P. M.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Bryon Mooney to adjourn the meeting at 7:30 P. M. Vote the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried. The Supervisors went into executive session with Attorney Budicak and John Clay present. The discussion was in reference to the abandon of streets in the township. Attorney Budicak explained the different situations that could be adopted when the ordinance is adopted and the meeting was adjourned at 8:05 P. M.
