

**PULASKI TOWNSHIP
REGULAR MEETING
July 14, 2014**

The Pulaski Township Supervisors meeting was called to order at 6:30 P. M. in the Township Building, 3401 Sunflower Road, New Brighton, PA by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. George Hage. Mr. Hage led the Pledge to the Flag.

In attendance were the following people: Terry Johnson, Vicky Scott, William Thomas, Thomas Albanese, Ray Hickman, Alan Hickey, Andrea Cain and Police Chief VanFossan. Attorney Budicak could not attend the meeting.

A motion was made by Doug Margetic and seconded by Byron Mooney to accept the minutes the Regular Meeting of June 9, 2014. Vote on the motion was: Mr. Hage, yes; Mr. Margetic, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Police: Chief Charles VanFossan was present. A report for June, 2014 with a total of 46 calls was given to the supervisors. He reported that nothing is going on. He was questioned about the reported calls and he said they are lower than a year ago.

Fire Department: Alan Hickey was present. It was reported the Fire Department had eleven calls last month. There was six in Daugherty Township, and five in Pulaski Township. The report will be put on file. He asked the Supervisors to contact Daugherty Township Supervisors and to set a meeting of both Township Supervisors, both Fire Departments to discuss the possibility of merging. He was asked about the bingo and Mr. Hickey stated that they weren't making any money and no one wanted to work at bingo. The Firemen don't have any fundraisers to support the Fire Department.

Code Enforcement/Zoning Officer: Ms. Dawn L. Pella was not present. She did submit a report for May, June and July. They will be put on file.

Mr. Albanese was present and his report for June will be put on file. Mr. Albanese answered questions of the citizens present. Mr. Albanese said he will proceed with the removal of trailers owned by Mike Beaver. Mr. Thomas inquired about the rental inspection process. Mr.

Albanese is inspecting difference rental properties now. He hopes to get at least one-third of all our rental properties inspected this year.

Recreation Commission: Mr. James McCullough was not present.

Roads: Mr. Margetic reported that Mike has been busy patching pot holes, cleaning catch basins on 41st Avenue and 42nd Avenue, measuring streets for the paving project, putting new speed limit signs on Rochester Road, cutting grass and picking up branches from the storms. Mr. Margetic was asked to check the pot holes at 38th Avenue and 46th Street.

A motion was made by Doug Margetic and seconded by Byron Mooney to accept the Committee Reports. Vote on the motion: Mr. Hage, yes; Mr. Margetic, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Doug Margetic to piggyback with the New Brighton Borough for paving the roads this year. Vote on the motion: Mr. Hage, yes; Mr. Margetic, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Byron Mooney to discontinue code enforcement with the D. L. Pella Consulting of Beaver Falls effective July 31, 2014. Vote on the motion: Mr. Hage, yes; Mr. Margetic, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Mr. Terry Johnson was there in reference to the catch basin on 46th Street and 38th Avenue. He questioned why the water can't be run down to Rochester Road. The Supervisors explained to him that Penn Dot won't allow that and there is just no place for the water to go. They have taken every avenue they could to try to fix the situation.

Mrs. Vicky Scott was present to asked for help with the noise situation at 3220 – 46th Street. They have parties and the music is unbelievable and it goes on for as long as 13 hours at a time. She has called the police repeatedly and nothing is being accomplished. They do burn outs from one end of the street to the other. The police come, they stop, and after they are gone they start up again. They had a recreational fire on the 4th of July that went on all night long. Mr. Thomas concurs with Mrs. Scott. You can't even sleep. The property is owned by Kathryn Nippert of 315 17th Street, New Brighton and Mr. Albanese will check into the matter. Mrs. Scott was advised by the Chief of Police that when she calls for the officer to report back to her. Mr. Albanese was asked about the three strikes – you're out ordinance. The police have to file three reports within a year to go into affect. Chief VanFossan informed people of the Crime Watch Neighborhood Meeting that

is held at the Lighthouse for the Blind, Third Avenue in New Brighton the last Tuesday of every month at 7:00 P. M. The public is invited and a lot of information is available at that time about various problems that may occur in your neighborhood and how to handle them.
