

**PULASKI TOWNSHIP
REGULAR MEETING
December 13, 2010**

The Pulaski Township Supervisors meeting was called to order at 6:30 P. M. in the Township Building, 3401 Sunflower Road, New Brighton, PA by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. Doug Margetic. Mr. Margetic led the Pledge to the Flag.

In attendance were the following people: George Doyle, Jim Barr, Wayne Everly, Donn Sheets, Jim Juillerat, Elaine and Richard Hildebrand, Larry Brobeck, Steve Procovich and Attorney Budicak.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Byron Mooney to accept the minutes of the November 8, 2010 Meeting and November 10, 2010 Emergency Special Meeting. Vote on the motion was: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Byron Mooney to accept the Treasurer's Report and to pay the bills. Vote on the motion was: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

Ms. Sally Ricci, a representative from Stone Harbor, Pulaski Homes, was present to give the Supervisors an explanation about the Program that is currently taking place in Pulaski Homes. This program is under the direction of Supportive Services, Inc. The program currently has five apartments that they are utilizing. One is for an office and three are being used now for residents. There are two persons (self sufficient) in an apartment. They are supervised 24/7. There are no sex offenders in the program. They are all Beaver County residents.

It is a program that can be used for mental patients, substance abuse and/or legal issues. It is a safe, therapeutic, regimented, transitional environment that promotes independence and recovery, teaches the value of hard work and self discipline, and assists persons in developing useful skills through a broad needs based program. They may be homeless, must be in an AA/NA program and must not display any life threatening or community damaging behaviors at the time of referral.

Ms. Ricci passed out informational sheets to everyone explaining in more detail how the program operates. They are hoping to move back to Rochester in the spring. They were formally located in Rochester for five years.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Police: Chief Charles Van Fossan was present. A report for November with a total of 41 calls was turned in to the supervisors. He had nothing to report.

Fire Department: Rich Morrell, the Fire Chief, was present. Mr. Morrell reported that there were two calls in Pulaski Township. They assisted at the fire at the Brighton Hot Dog Shoppe. He informed the Supervisors that he is no longer the Fire Chief and he would instruct the new chief to get me any information that I need.

Code Enforcement/Zoning Officer: Mr. John Clay, Code Enforcement Officer, was present. He reported he had no building permits for November and tagged two vehicles which were removed immediately. He thanked the supervisors, fire department, the police department and everyone concerned with the rat situation on 47th Street. It is all cleaned up now. He also said that he is in touch with the Department of Labor and Industry in reference to a maintenance code ordinance that the township needs to adopt that will continue to give them the authority to update the codes each time they are revised.

Recreation: Mr. Barr was in attendance. He had nothing new to report.

Roads: Mr. Margetic reported that Mike Zachodni has been busy spreading millings, picking up branches, picking up leaves, getting the truck ready to plow and backfilling at the house on 47th Street. He worked with the pavers and 32nd Street, 39th Street and 37th Way were completed. Also 30th Street, New England Hill, the road has been paved and that now completes our grants for the 30th Street Project. Mr. Margetic thanked Mr. Mooney for helping Mike with the collection of the leaves this past month.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Byron Mooney to accept the Committee Reports. Vote on the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

OLD BUSINESS

There was no old business to conduct.

NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Doug Margetic to adopt Resolution #349 adopting the 2011 Budget. The General Fund is \$311,480 and State Aid is \$77,000. The millage will stay the same. Vote on the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Byron Mooney to adopt the 2011 Meeting Schedule per attached. Vote on the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Doug Margetic to adopt the Township Disclosure Statement required by Chapter 7-A of Act 44, The Municipal Pension Plan Funding Standard and Recovery Act. Vote on the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

A motion was made by and seconded by to advertize for the closing of paper streets in the Township. Vote on the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Doug Margetic to approve the sub-division of James and Mary Cornelius property on 45th Street. It has been approved by the Planning Commission and sent to the Beaver County Planning Commission for their approval. Vote on the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Mr. Barr again asked why the road man does not attend the meetings like the rest of the people like himself and Mr. Clay. Mr. Margetic said that he has told Mike Zachodni that he does not have to attend the meetings since he gives a report.

Mr. Everly said that the water problem has been helped some. He wanted to know why no one knew about what was going on with the Pulaski Homes and Stone Harbor. No one from the Housing Authority ever approached the Supervisors or the Police that they were having that program.

Mr. Donn Sheets asked what is going on with the property across the street. It just keeps getting worse and worse. Every month he hears the same answer – we are working on it.

Mrs. Hildebrand inquired about the Jim Hovancik property. Mr. & Mrs. Hildebrand asked if the township had an ordinance on parking on the street. Forty-Third Street is bad. Some people park with all four tires on the road. Mr. Clay will check into the matter.

Mr. Brobeck asked why the roadman can't pick up his hedges, branches, etc. The township has a shredder. It is located in New Brighton. He was instructed to contact New Brighton if he wants to take his branches, etc to be shredded. Mr. Zachodni only picks up branches after a storm. If he starts to pick up Mr. Brobeck's branches, hedges, etc. then everyone will want that done. He also reported that there are signs missing in the township and all the signs should be the same. Some are leaning over, not the same height and need to be fixed.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Margetic announced that the next meeting will be held on December 29, 2010 at 4:00 P. M. to close the year.

The next regular meeting will be held on Monday, January 10, 2011.

Mr. Margetic wished everyone a Very Merry Christmas and A Happy Prosperous New Year.
