

**PULASKI TOWNSHIP  
ORDINANCE NUMBER #243**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PULASKI, COUNTY OF  
BEAVER, AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, PROVIDING  
FOR THE RENAMING OF CERTAIN STREETS AND ROADWAYS  
WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP.**

**Whereas,** Pulaski Township, under the authority of article XXIII, Section 2329, of the Second Class Township Code, Act of May 1, 1933, P.L. 103, as amended by Act of, Nov. 9, 1995, P.L. 350, No. 60, § 1, 53 P.S. 67329, is empowered to require and regulate by ordinance the naming of streets or roads; and

**Whereas,** Pulaski Township, in order to promote the general health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Pulaski Township, has recognized the need for emergency services personnel and others to quickly locate structures and buildings within Pulaski Township; and

**Whereas,** Pulaski Township has determined that certain privately-maintained streets or roads are not properly named or marked with proper signage to direct emergency personnel and others seeking to locate buildings within the Township; and

**Whereas,** Pulaski Township has determined that a uniform system for the assignment of street or road names for all streets or roads, both public and private, is necessary to preserve the general health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Pulaski Township; and

**Whereas,** through a process of updating current house and building numbers and street or road names, the Township of Pulaski has decided that certain existing addresses need to be amended for clarification in order for the Township of Pulaski to carry out its duties; and

**Whereas,** the Township heretofore, specifically Ordinance 242, did adopt an Ordinance providing for the assignment of certain building numbers and designation of certain streets or roads; and

**Whereas,** the Supervisors of the Township of Pulaski believe that clarification and simplicity is needed to define the exact streets and roadways as they exist in the Township.

**Now therefore,** Pulaski Township, under, and by virtue of, and pursuant to the authority granted the by Second Class Township Code, does hereby enact and ordain that Appendix H of the Code of Ordinances of Pulaski Township, shall have the following as a supplement and is hereby amended as follows:

**Section 1.** The aforementioned Appendix H shall have added to the same a change of street addresses for various properties located within Pulaski Township as stated on the attached Exhibit "A".

**Section 2.** The changes in street names as listed in the attached Exhibit “A” has such changes as further described as follows:

1. 37<sup>th</sup> Way from 39<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 42<sup>nd</sup> Avenue is now Stang Street
2. 38<sup>th</sup> Way from 39<sup>th</sup> Avenue to property now or formerly owned by Nancy J. Silvestri, et al, as recorded at Instrument No. 3425870 in the Beaver County Recorder of Deeds and property now or formerly of Mark S. Weldhaus as recorded at Instrument No. 3411033 of the Beaver County Recorder of Deeds; is now Conley Street
3. 39<sup>th</sup> Way from 39<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue is now Brandon Street
4. New street known as Donawitz Avenue from Sunflower Road to property now or formerly of Douglas E. Donawitz as recorded in Deed Book Volume 1082, page 659 in the Beaver County Recorder of Deeds
5. New street known as School Street from 34<sup>th</sup> Street to property now or formerly of the New Brighton Area School District
6. New street known as Sheets Avenue from 44<sup>th</sup> Street to 47<sup>th</sup> Street; formerly known as Oak Avenue or 31<sup>st</sup> Lane
7. 31<sup>st</sup> Lane from 44<sup>th</sup> Street to 47<sup>th</sup> Street and beyond to property now or formerly of Robert A. Kroskey, Jr., et ux., as recorded in the Beaver County Recorder of Deeds at Instrument No. 3165979 is now 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue
8. 37<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Sunflower Road to 43<sup>rd</sup> Street is now North 37<sup>th</sup> Avenue
9. 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue from the intersection of 43<sup>rd</sup> Street & 41<sup>st</sup> Street thence to property now or formerly of George Cox, et ux., as recorded in the Beaver County Recorder of Deeds at Instrument No. 3237577 is now McCarthy Avenue
10. 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Sunflower Road to 43<sup>rd</sup> Street is now North 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue
11. 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue from 43<sup>rd</sup> Street to 34<sup>th</sup> Street is now North 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue
12. 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue from 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to 34<sup>th</sup> Street is now Engle Avenue
13. 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue from the intersection of North 33<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and 34<sup>th</sup> Street to North 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue is now North 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue
14. 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue from 34<sup>th</sup> Street to 33<sup>rd</sup> Street is now North 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue
15. 40<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Sunflower Road to 41<sup>st</sup> Street is now North 40<sup>th</sup> Avenue
16. 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue from 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to 34<sup>th</sup> Street is now North 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue

17. 33<sup>rd</sup> Lane from Sunflower Road in a more or less northerly direction is now Zilk Avenue

18. 40<sup>th</sup> Lane as previously existed coming off 49<sup>th</sup> Street in a more or less northerly direction from the same is no longer recognized as a separate roadway but rather is now part of 49<sup>th</sup> Street

**Section 3.** Any persons, firm or corporation who shall alter, deface, remove or destroy any street signs to be displayed as a result of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than three hundred (\$300) dollars, the costs of prosecution, and reasonable attorney's fees, and, in default of payment thereof, to imprisonment of not more than thirty (30) days.

**Section 4.** In the event that any provision, section, sentence or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not effect or impair any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, as the provision are severable and would have been enacted had not such invalid provisions been included herein.

**Section 5.** All Ordinances or part of Ordinances, which are inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

**THIS ORDINANCE** is duly enacted and ordained this 13th day of October, 2014, and shall become effective immediately and remain in force until modified, amended, or rescinded by Pulaski Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania.
