## CONTINUED PARTICIPATION IN THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR POLICE PROTECTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PULASKI, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AUTHORIZING THE CONTINUED PARTICIPATION IN THE INTERGOVERMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT FOR POLICE PROTECTION SERVICES WITH THE BOROUGH OF NEW BRIGHTON FOR A PERIOD OF AT LEAST THREE YEARS AND SETTING ANNUAL CONTRACT FEES FOR THE ASSOCIATED SERVICES.

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Pulaski and the Borough of New Brighton have shared a long history as neighbors, friends, and family within the New Brighton Area School District with the Borough of New Brighton providing police protection services to the Township of Pulaski since 1995; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Supervisors of the Township of Pulaski desires to continue to receive police protection services from the Borough of New Brighton for the calendar years of 2020, 2021 and 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Supervisors of the Township of Pulaski and the Borough Council of the Borough of New Brighton believe it is in the best interest of both the recipient of the police protection services and provider of the police services to establish fees for future years for budgetary planning purposes.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** THAT THE Township Supervisors of the Township for Pulaski agrees to continue to be the recipient of police protection services from the Borough of New Brighton as outlined in the intergovernmental cooperation agreement dated November 17, 1994; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the established fee for police protection services for the Township of Pulaski by the Borough of New Brighton be set a \$112,703.63 for 2020, \$114,957.70 for 2021, and \$117,256.86 for 2022; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the agreement for police protection services between the Township of Pulaski and the Borough of New Brighton will continue to renew itself annually beyond 2022 contingent upon a contract price to be negotiated between both municipalities.
