

**PULASKI TOWNSHIP
REGULAR MEETING
May 9, 2011**

The Pulaski Township Supervisors meeting was called to order at 6:30 P. M. in the Township Building, 3401 Sunflower Road, New Brighton, PA by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. Doug Margetic. Mr. Margetic led the Pledge to the Flag.

CORRESPONDENCE

Mr. Tim Schultzman of Daniel C. Baker Engineers was present. He gave a slide presentation of the MS4 Program in Pulaski Township and explained what needs to be done and all the requirements the state has mandated.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Police: Chief Charles Van Fossan was present. A report for April with a total of 57 calls was turned in to the supervisors. He had nothing to report.

Fire Department: Scott Roeder, Fire Chief was present. He reported there were three fire calls in Daugherty and one in Pulaski Township.

Code Enforcement/Zoning Officer: Mr. John Clay, Code Enforcement Officer, was present. He reported he had seventeen complaints in April. Six building permits were issued. There is a final meeting of the Hazard Mitigation Committee on May 10th.

He did some research on conditional uses. They would be for all districts. (Halfway Houses, Women's Shelters, Transitional Housing (occupancy less than six) and the following would be limited to commercial districts: Methadone Clinics, residential drug/alcohol treatment housing, (occupancy) Drug/Alcohol Counseling Centers (non-occupancy), Homeless Shelters and Intermediate Punishment centers (non-occupancy). All of these uses needed to be added to the definitions. The township should consider adopting an Alternative Energy Ordinance also.

Attorney Budicak will check into the subject of amending zoning ordinances.

Recreation: Mr. Barr was in attendance. Mr. Barr gave the secretary a Newsletter from the Borough of New Brighton. Larry Morley, Borough Manager, would like to see the newsletter to include information from all the school district communities (Pulaski, Daugherty and Fallston).

Roads: Mike has been busy taking the winter equipment off the trucks and getting the grass cutting equipment ready. He has been cleaning out catch basins, patching potholes, cutting grass and spreading millings and picking up branches. Mr. Mooney said Mike has been doing a great job.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Bryon Mooney to accept the Committee Reports. Vote on the motion: Mr. Margetic, yes; Mr. Hage, yes and Mr. Mooney, yes. The motion was carried.

There was no old business to conduct.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Mrs. Henn asked to address the Board. She stated that in the April meeting she was accused of telling someone from Penn Pavilion not to attend our meeting. She said she has never told anyone to not attend our meetings. In fact, she encourages people to attend. She didn't appreciate be accused of something she did not do. Her call to Penn Pavilion was to request information to give to the Supervisors and that was all.

Steve Procovich gave the secretary \$100.00 to give to the Boy Scouts and Girls Scouts for the fine job they did on litter patrol.

Mr. Procovich asked why Mr. Mooney was campaigning against Mr. Margetic. The Board of Supervisors are doing a great job and should be working together. Why would you not work with the people you have been working with for a year?

Mrs. Linda Breen wanted to know what is going to be done on 40th Lane and 49th Street. She said she can't get in or out of her driveway because of ice on 49th Street.

Mr. Juilleratt asked what is to be done with the property next to his at 3214 – 47th Street. He cut the grass last year, but he won't do it anymore. Also, what is being done about the motorcycles not stopping at stop signs. He was told by the Chief of Police to call the police department. They say the kids do not have a license.

Debbie Hickman asked about solar panels in the township. Attorney Budicak stated that they cannot abolish them completely, but they can control them.

Mr. Lyons was issuing a complaint again about the dogs running loose and crapping in his yard. Mr. Kati was asked to clean it up, but doesn't cooperate. He has two big dogs that run loose all the time.
