

**PULASKI TOWNSHIP  
REGULAR MEETING  
August 12, 2019**

The Pulaski Township Supervisors meeting was called to order at 6:30 P. M. in the Township Building, 3401 Sunflower Road, New Brighton, PA by the Chairman of the Board, Mr. George Hage. Mr. Hage led the Pledge to the Flag.

In attendance were the following people: Chief Walton, Don Chapman, Peggy Griffith, Vanessa & Dan Draper, Quinten Wagurak, Susan Oettle, Charles Cox, Candy Surgalski, Mindy Massie and Attorney Joseph M. Budicak.

A motion was made by George Hage and seconded by Casey Zachodni to approve the minutes of the July 8, 2019 work session and regular meeting. Vote on the motion was: Mr. Hage, yes; Mr. Zachodni, yes and Mrs. Kruse, yes. The motion was carried.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

1. Vanessa and Dan Draper were present to discuss the property at 3920 – 39<sup>th</sup> Street. They are tired of the dogs everywhere, the garbage everyone and there is all kinds of varmints in the area because of the high grass. Mrs. Griffith stated that she sent a letter to the property owner. Mr. Draper commented on the condition of Brandon Street. It is terrible shape and he was informed that it is on the list to be paved this year (hopefully this month). It is under contract but we aren't sure of the exact date they will be here.

2. Quinten Wagurak passed out papers on the burning ordinances. The police have been called for his burning. People across the street and a couple doors down from his place are burning every day, and he burns once and the police only come to his place. Why is he being targeted? He has a burning pit. The ordinance states that burning can be done from 10 a.m. to 6 p. m. Tuesday through Saturday. The assistance Fire Chief stated that there is no burning ban this year in the summer months.

He also questioned about shooting bow and arrows in the township. The police addressed the situation.

3. Candy Surgalski registered a complaint about the fireworks set off this year. She wants people fined. She said she called the police and the police was laughing with the people shooting off the fireworks. She had to clean up debris on her house, her yard and her car. She also complained about the people driving too fast on 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue, quads, motorcycles, mini bikes. Chief Walton stated that they are permitted on the roads.

4. Charles Cox complained about the fireworks this year too. He wants the supervisors to put a stop to it. Mr. Hage said that they are legal in Pennsylvania and the supervisors have no control over fireworks. He said the loud booms scares his dog and people should take them to Rochester to put off.

He also wanted the supervisors to tell him what to do about the spring water coming from his neighbor's property. Attorney Budicak told him that the supervisors cannot tell him what to do. That is a between him and his neighbor. Also, he is sick or people speeding and running stop signs. That is a problem everywhere – not just in Pulaski Township. Call the police.

5. Mindy Massie was in attendance about the water runoff on 41<sup>st</sup> Street. She wants the Township to put a curb on the bend at the top of 41<sup>st</sup> Street. The water runoff is washing away her yard and driveway. They explained to her that a curb will not solve the problem. Curbing won't stay unless the road is paved. The paving of that road is in the future, but not this year.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Police:** Chief Walton was present. A report for June, 2019 was given to the supervisors with 66 calls. The July, 2019 report had 47 calls on it. He had nothing more to add.

**Fire Department:** Don Chapman, Assistant Fire Chief, was present and he reported six fire calls in Pulaski Township and eleven in Daugherty Township for July, 2019. The report will be put on file.

**Code Enforcement and Zoning Officer:** Mrs. Griffith was present. Her report will be put on file. She stated that the Hanshe property has been demolished. She is still trying to find out more information on the motor home.

**Recreation:** Mr. Cracker was not present. There was no report.

**Roads:** Mike Zachodni was busy in July with cleaning equipment, cleaning catch basins on 41<sup>st</sup> Street, Rochester Road, McCarthy Avenue, 39<sup>th</sup> Street, 43<sup>rd</sup> Street and 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue (five times), cut grass and weed whack, clean debris from the storms, pick up branches on 47<sup>th</sup> Street, 39<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 38<sup>th</sup> Street, trim tree (Engle Avenue), patch holes on 42<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, Conley Street, 30<sup>th</sup> Street and 41<sup>st</sup> Street, chipping branches from storm on 45<sup>th</sup> Street and 46<sup>th</sup> Street and worked on a sink hole on 45<sup>th</sup> Street.
